When you do, be sure to remove the cut grass.

Home Remodeling and Repair

It's construction season again, and time to remind everyone to contact the Architectural Review Committee for approval before you do anything at all to the exterior of your home. That includes painting (even repainting the same color), roofing, window replacements, garage door replacements, fences, swamp cooler and air conditioner installation — everything.

The ARC has lists of preapproved colors and materials, and is always ready to review new ones if none of the preapproved choices suit.
